Ingestion: Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Do NOT induce vomiting.

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects Both Acute and Delayed

General: During processing, inhalation of fumes may cause dizziness and/or irritation to the eyes, nose, and throat. Hot molten product will cause thermal burns to the skin.

Inhalation: Do not breathe vapors from molten product.

Skin Contact: Risk of thermal burns on contact with molten product.

Eye Contact: Risk of thermal burns on contact with molten product.

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Ingestion: Ingestion is likely to be harmful or have adverse effects.

Chronic Symptoms: None expected under normal conditions of use.
